



Global Liveability Index 2025

Why in news: Urbanisation and migration are rising due to the pursuit of **better economic opportunities and quality of life.**

Prelims and Mains context:

- This has led to focus on “**liveable cities**” – sustainable, inclusive, and offering essential **services, infrastructure, and personal/professional growth.**

About the Global Liveability Index 2025

- Released by the **Economist Intelligence Unit (EIU).**
- Assesses **173 cities worldwide** based on **comfort and quality of life.**
- Based on **30 indicators** grouped under five key categories: **Stability, Healthcare, Culture & Environment, Education and Infrastructure.**
- Each indicator is rated from **acceptable to intolerable** and scored on a **scale of 1 to 100.**
- Provides **category-wise and overall scores**, along with a **global ranking.**

Key Highlights

- **Global average liveability score** remained unchanged at **76.1/100.**
- **Improvements** noted in **education, healthcare, and infrastructure.**
- **Stability scores declined** (by 0.2 points) due to **geopolitical unrest, civil strife, and housing crises.**

Do you know?

- **Urbanisation** is the transformation of a society from **predominantly rural to urban**, marked by a **rising urban population and growth of cities and towns.**
- It includes not only **physical expansion** but also **social, economic, and cultural transformations** of urban areas.
- The **Indian Census** classifies urban areas into **two categories: Statutory Towns and Census Towns.**
- **Statutory Towns** are areas with **urban local bodies** like **municipal corporations, municipalities, or municipal committees.**
- **Census Towns** must meet **three criteria:**
 - a) **Population of at least 5,000 persons**
 - b) **Population density of 400 persons per sq. km**
 - c) **At least 75% of the male workforce engaged in non-agricultural activities.**

Top Performers

- **Copenhagen** ranked **1st**, surpassing **Vienna** after three years.
 - Achieved **perfect scores** in **stability, education, and infrastructure.**
- **Vienna** outperformed in **healthcare** but dropped due to **terror threats.**
- **Western Europe** dominated the rankings, followed by **Asia-Pacific.**
- **Vancouver** represented **North America** in the top ten.

Bottom Performers

- **Damascus (Syria)** remained the **least liveable city** with a score of **30.7.**
- Other low-ranking cities: **Tripoli, Dhaka, Karachi.**
- Poor performance linked to **conflict, weak infrastructure, and poor services.**

Regional Notes

- **Middle East and Africa** cities remained low but saw **marginal gains** in healthcare, education, and infrastructure.
- **Stability scores declined** in **Tehran, Taiwan, and India** due to **mounting tensions and armed conflict threats.**
